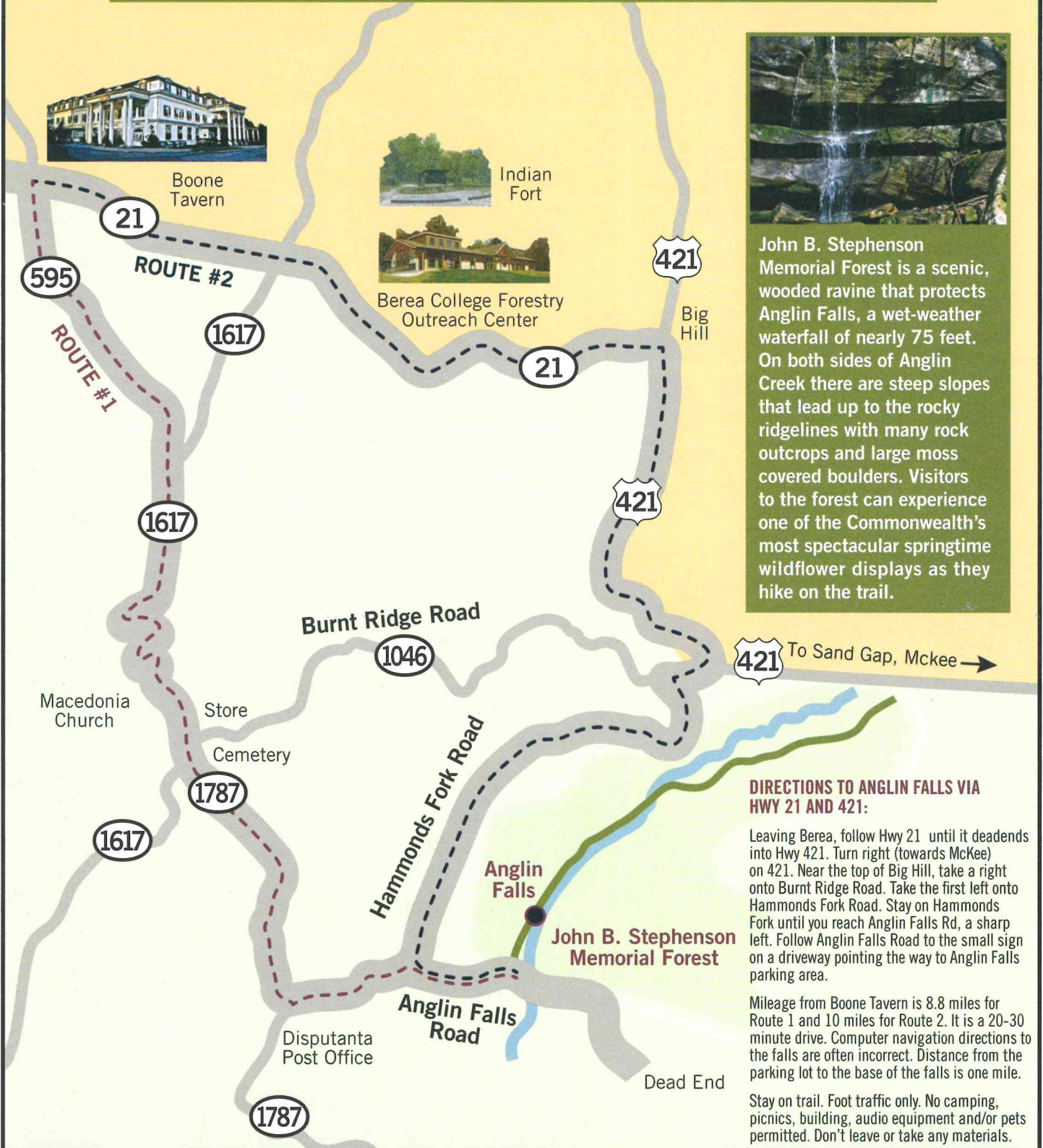

John B. Stephenson Memorial Forest is a scenic, wooded ravine that protects Anglin Falls, a wet-weather waterfall of nearly 75 feet. On both sides of Anglin Creek there are steep slopes that lead up to the rocky ridgelines with many rock outcrops and large moss covered boulders. Visitors to the forest can experience one of the Commonwealth's most spectacular springtime wildflower displays as they hike on the trail.



### DIRECTIONS TO ANGLIN FALLS VIA HWY 21 AND 421:

Leaving Berea, follow Hwy 21 until it deadends into Hwy 421. Turn right (towards McKee) on 421. Near the top of Big Hill, take a right onto Burnt Ridge Road. Take the first left onto Hammonds Fork Road. Stay on Hammonds Fork until you reach Anglin Falls Rd, a sharp left. Follow Anglin Falls Road to the small sign on a driveway pointing the way to Anglin Falls parking area.

Mileage from Boone Tavern is 8.8 miles for Route 1 and 10 miles for Route 2. It is a 20-30 minute drive. Computer navigation directions to the falls are often incorrect. Distance from the parking lot to the base of the falls is one mile.

Stay on trail. Foot traffic only. No camping, picnics, building, audio equipment and/or pets permitted. Don't leave or take any materials.
